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Day 1 Fly to Hanoi *Saturday 27 February*

Morning departure with Thai Airways via Bangkok from London Heathrow Terminal 3

Day 2 In Hanoi *Sunday 28 February*

We arrive into Noi Bai airport this morning and transfer to our hotel. This afternoon we have a cyclo ride and walking tour of the city's Old Quarter. A welcome dinner has been arranged at a smart local restaurant. Two nights at the Majestic Salute hotel (B,D)

Day 3 In Hanoi *Monday 1 March*

This morning we visit the Ba Dinh Square where silent sentries guard the marble Mausoleum of Ho Chi Minh. We continue to the ornate Temple of Literature and striking One Pillar Pagoda. The afternoon is left at leisure before we take an early restaurant dinner in order to enjoy a performance of the city's famed water puppetry (B,D)

Day 4 Visit Halong Bay *Tuesday 2 March*

We venture to an area of the country's most spectacular scenery today, specifically the world heritage listed natural marvel of Halong Bay. We have a relaxing excursion onboard a traditional junk on the Bay with a seafood lunch. We will be able to stop at some of the grottoes and caves on the islands to explore on foot. Overnight at Halong Plaza hotel with dinner (B,L,D)

Day 5 Fly to Hue. City Tour *Wednesday 3 March*

We fly to the old Imperial capital of Hue this morning. We spend the afternoon visiting the historic monuments of this once great city including the Citadel and the Imperial Enclosure within it. Overnight with dinner at the Saigon Morin hotel (B,D)

Day 6 Perfume River trip. PM Drive to Hoi An *Thursday 4 March*

This morning we cruise down the picturesque Perfume River and visit some of the majestic Royal tombs of the Emperors. This afternoon we head south stopping at the fabulous Museum of Cham Sculpture at Danang before arriving at the idyllic riverside town of Hoi An. Two nights at the Hoi An Tourist hotel. Dinner at a smart local restaurant (B,D)

Day 7 In Hoi An. City Tour *Friday 5 March*

Hoi An is an enchanting riverside town recently listed UNESCO World Heritage status. After a guided tour of its Old Town this morning, the rest of the day is left free to enjoy Hoi An at your own pace. Dinner at the hotel (B,D)

Day 8 Visit My Son. Fly to Ho Chi Minh City *Saturday 6 March*

We visit the jungle-strewn site of My Son this morning, dating from the 7th century ancient kingdom of Champa. UNESCO listed, the ruins are set in a stunning lush valley and the drive there is equally scenic. We return to Danang airport for our late afternoon flight to Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon). We transfer to the Kim Do hotel for three nights. Dinner tonight is at one of Saigon's top restaurants. (B,L,D)

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Day 9 In Ho Chi Minh City *Sunday 7 March*

This morning we have a city tour and include a visit to the striking Reunification Palace and view the excellent collection of artefacts housed in the History Museum. We also visit the American War Museum, a poignant reminder of Vietnam's recent terrible conflicts. The afternoon is left free to explore this buzzing and absorbing city. Dinner at a smart city restaurant (B,D)

Day 10 In Ho Chi Minh City. Visit Cu Chi Tunnels *Monday 8 March*

The morning is left free for further time to enjoy the city. In the afternoon we visit the Cu Chi tunnels made so famous from the legacy of the Vietnam War. Dinner at a city restaurant (B,D)

Day 11 Visit Mekong Delta villages *Tuesday 9 March*

Today we venture into the fertile Mekong Delta, the nation's rice basket to allow a glimpse into the life of Vietnam's agricultural workforce. We visit the floating market at Cai Be, where we pause for lunch and continue to Vinh Long to see the traditional stilt houses. We drive to the busy harbour town of Can Tho for our overnight stop at the charming colonial style Victoria hotel with dinner (B,L,D)

Day 12 Mekong River Cruise to Phnom Penh *Wednesday 10 March*

This morning we cruise by motorboat on the Mekong River via Chau Doc located on the Cambodian border arriving into Phnom Penh, with its exotic river setting and French colonial charm, in the late afternoon. Two nights at the Sunway hotel. A typical Cambodian dinner has been arranged at a smart city restaurant (B,L,D)

Day 13 In Phnom Penh *Thursday 11 March*

Our morning tour includes the National Museum with its impressive collection of Angkor sculptures and the Royal Palace with its stunning Silver Pagoda. In the afternoon there is the option to visit the infamous Killing Fields of Choeung Ek, a memorial to the horrors of Pol Pot's despotic regime. Dinner at a local restaurant (B,D)

Day 14 In Phnomh Penh. Fly Siem Reap *Friday 12 March*

A morning at leisure in the capital before our afternoon flight to Siem Reap, our base for the next three nights and located close to the remarkable ancient temple complex of Angkor. Three nights at the Angkor Century hotel with dinner (B,D)

Day 15 and 16 Visit Angkor Temples *Saturday 13 March*

We have two full days to explore the spectacular temples and jungle ruins around Angkor. The highlight of the tour, these ancient Khmer ruins are one of the world's most magical and breathtaking archaeological sites. Our visits will include the majesty of the Bayon and Ta Prohm temples, to the captivating setting of Angkor Wat itself. We will also be able to venture to some of the more remote ruins. Dinner is taken at the various restaurants available in Siem Reap (B,D each day)

Day 17 In Siem Reap. Fly to London via Singapore *Sunday 14 March*

We have the option to return to the temple complex of Angkor Wat this morning and explore the site at our own pace. Otherwise the local markets in Siem Reap or even a relaxing swim in the hotel pool are available. In the mid-afternoon we transfer the short distance to the International airport for our evening flight via Singapore to London with Singapore Airways (B)

Day 18 Arrive London *Monday 15 March*

We arrive into Heathrow Terminal 3 in the early morning
